Dear Brother Bishops,

I am privileged to serve along with Bishop Paul Loverde on the Religious Alliance Against Pornography (RAAP). The Alliance has members from the Orthodox Church, several Protestant Churches, and representatives from the Jewish and Muslim communities.

For the last two years, RAAP has provided national webinars, which are typically focused on protecting families and marriages from pornography. The next webinar entitled "Parents, Kids and Pornography: The Attack on a Generation" will focus on the use of pornography by youth within our faith communities, along with practical steps that parents and religious leaders can implement to protect our youth.

An anonymous survey at a Catholic high school indicated that 70% of the students reported viewing pornography several times per week or more, while only 11% of the students reported that they did not view pornography (1). Internet pornography has indeed become an "attack on a generation," which is negatively impacting the majority of youth both in our parishes and in other faith communities.

Along with this letter I have included a copy of the RAAP flyer for the next webinars on November 7th and November 16th. I encourage you to consider promoting these RAAP webinars to priests, Catholic leaders and parents. I also included an infographic that was designed after a recent clergy training day on pornography in Kansas City. Perhaps, you might find the infographic useful in discerning how you might want to provide guidance to the members of your archdioceses/dioceses.

talking to our youth about the issue? How do we do this? What are some steps we can take with users and those who have become addicted? How do we help them in


safely using the technological devices that are connected to the internet?
