SCRIPTURE READINGS: THE 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading ~ 2 Kings 5: 14-17

Elisha, who lived about 800 years before Christ, was the successor of the great prophet Elijah. Naaman was a pagan army officer from Syria who came to Elisha, seeking a cure for his leprosy.

Second Reading ~ 2 Timothy 2: 8-13

The second letter to Timothy was written about 30 years after Paul's death. Today's passage begins with a summary of Paul's teachings about Christ and concludes with what may be part of an ancient Christian hymn.

Gospel ~ Luke 17: 11-19

In today's story, Jesus cures ten lepers, and among them is an Israelite. Luke then tells us that one of the lepers, upon realizing that he was healed, "returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked Him. He was a Samaritan." The only one who returned to give thanks was a foreigner and the foreigner's faith brought his salvation.
