Once again, we are very pleased to announce that Father Tom McCarthy will be returning to our Parish Community to conduct a Parish Mission. Father Tom will be here on **November 13th**, **14th**, **and 15th**. The theme for this year's Mission is "*Treasures of our Faith*, *the Seven Sacraments*." This will be third time that Father Tom will be here, having given a Parish Mission in 2019 and again in 2021.

Father Tom is an experienced teacher, administrator, retreat director and a preacher of parish missions. He is a native of the South Side of Chicago. He grew up in St. Adrian Parish in Marquette Park. He received his elementary school education at St. Adrian School and high school education at St. Rita of Cascia High School. SCRIPTURE READINGS: THE 29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading ~Exodus 17: 8-13

The Book of Exodus tells of the Israelites" escape from Egypt and their journey to the Promised Land. Along the way, they often had to battle local tribes who tried to keep them from passing through the territory. Today, we hear an account of one such incident.

Second Reading ~ 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

In today's reading from second Timothy, the author continues to warn against false teaching. This passage also provides the biblical foundation for our belief about the inspiration of the Bible.

Gospel ~ **Luke 18:1-8**

The parable of the widow's persistence is introduced as a parable about prayer and not losing heart, then moves into a story about justice, and ends with a question about faith. A sign of faith is a willingness to persist in prayer, persisting against all odds. Another sign may be in what we pray for: daily bread, the Holy Spirit, the kingdom, and justice.
