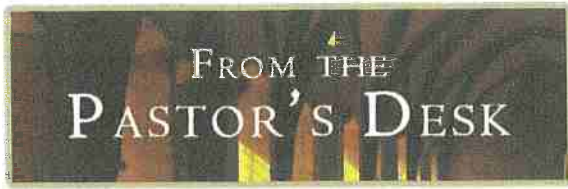

Remembering Our Departed Brothers and Sisters

During the month of November, we are especially mindful of our deceased loved ones, commending them to the Lord and praying for all those who are grieving their loss. On November 3rd, over 450 people gathered in church as we celebrated our Annual Memorial Mass. During the Liturgy, we remembered and prayed for all those who entered into eternal life during the past year, and we also prayed for all those who gathered in remembrance of their loved ones.

On that Thursday evening, I thanked everyone for accepting our invitation to come to the Memorial Mass because in their coming together they were supporting each other as they journeyed through their grief. I acknowledged that there is pain in separating from their loved one, but now our loved ones are free from all pain and suffering which they endured in this life here on earth; but I asked what about ourselves? How are we doing? Depending on the relationship and especially when there is a sudden death when there was no time for some final words, family members and friends might be left with some regrets. I said that even with the best of relationships with our loved one, there may be somethings that we regret, words and sentiments which were never spoken or expressed or perhaps words and sentiments which should never have been spoken or expressed. During my homily, I quoted, Katherine Mansfield, a renowned author from the early part of the 20th century, she wrote, **“Regret is an appalling waste of time. You can’t build on it. You can only wallow in it.”** I then went on to quote Martha Whitmore Hickman, who in her book, *Healing After Loss*, wrote:

“Of course, there are things we regret. Things we wish we’d done differently. Even where there has been time to say all the appropriate things, images will flash in our minds, and we’d give a lot to be able to change. Keep this in mind, surely, our loved one has forgiven us. Can we forgive ourselves?”

This is a very important question to ask ourselves.

Our loved one would not want us burdened with any regret. I said that we cannot change the past, but we can certainly affect the future. Among some of the suggestions that I made, I said that in the memory of our loved one, we can give expression to our love to those around us now, not waiting, not hesitating in any way, but saying what is in our hearts. As we do this, the ill feeling of regret can eventually go away. I also suggested that reaching out to those who experienced a death of their loved one can also bring some healing to our hearts. Our very presence will be helping others who are just beginning the grieving process.

At the conclusion of the Memorial Mass, during the post Communion period, with 109 Memorial Candles glowing in the darkness of the church, the congregation listened to our Parish Choir sing *“Holy Darkness.”* As it is each year, it was a very moving and most beautiful experience of God’s grace. That particular moment in time reminded everyone that we do not grieve alone! We were truly one in mind, heart, and soul. Yes, we were united in our grief but most especially, we were united in our faith, proclaiming through our tears that we will see our loved ones again.

As a remembrance of their loved ones, and as a reminder of our continuing concern for our invited guests, each family took home their Memorial Candle with their loved one’s name inscribed upon it. This special candle can be re-lighted at any time, but especially on special days in the life of their loved one; in particular, the day of their loved one’s birth into this world, the day of their loved one’s birth into eternal life or a special anniversary date.

As pastor and as the celebrant of the Memorial Mass, I must say that once again, I was quite proud that we, as a Parish Community here at St. Frances Cabrini, were able to provide the Memorial Mass. I am equally proud and grateful to our Parish Staff and indeed, everyone who worked behind the scenes at the Mass to minister to those who came to remember their loved ones and also those who assisted in setting up for the social gathering in the Monsignor Woods Hall before the Memorial Mass and helped serve the refreshments after the Memorial Mass. I thank one and all.

IN ORDINARY TIME**



First Reading ~ Malachi 3:19-20a

The Book of Malachi was written after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon. Faced with problems on all sides, many in the community doubted whether God would ever again act on their behalf. In today's passage, Malachi responds to these skeptics.

Second Reading ~ 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

The second letter to the Thessalonians addresses concerns early Christians have about the coming of Christ in glory. Some were excessively interested in the day and hour of Christ's coming. Others thought that his imminent coming was an invitation to idleness.

Gospel ~ Luke 21:5-19

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the destruction of the temple and the end times in relationship to each other. Jesus assures His followers that if they remain faithful to Him through persecution "not a hair on your head will be destroyed," because there is life after death.
