Advent: Waiting and Preparing in Expectation

From *Thanks* and *Giving* through Black Friday into what? If you look around, Christmas has been here for months already, but there are still big sales to shop, whether online or in store and large festivities to plan... is this what being a grown-up Christian feels like? What happened to Advent? Where, oh, where is that time to fast and pray to ready myself for Jesus' coming?

Advent is an ancient practice of the Church to help the faithful prepare for the Second Coming of Christ as much as the cute baby in the manger on Christmas. Although it can feel like Lent, especially in the earlier days and in the Greek Churches, still with lots of fasting and abstinence, I was always drawn more towards a newer understanding of Advent by focusing on Mary and Joseph as first-time expectant parents and join in their *Expectation* and *Waiting*.

Like any first-time parents, there are many things to do and plans to be put into place before a new life joins a household. This is where we meet Advent: in that expectation and preparation for what is to come - the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love that is promised to come with Christ born for us then and still to come when He comes again.

This is an opportunity to <u>STOP... SLOW DOWN</u> the pace... take some time to <u>WAIT</u> for the Lord in our everyday lives... as the world gets darker and colder... we can light a candle each night on a wreath that reminds us that God's love is never ending. First Reading ~ Isaiah 2: 1-5

Second Reading ~ Romans 13:11-14

Gospel ~ Matthew 24:37-44

The Gospel that the Church proclaims today is not about Jesus' coming as a babe in Bethlehem, but about Jesus' coming as the Son of Man. There is an urgent tone to the reading: "So too, you also must be prepared..." We are being urged not simply to remember the birth of Jesus many years ago, but to prepare for the coming of Jesus today and at the end of time.




HOSPITALITY GATHERING






