Christmas TRADITIONS

Why do we.....? A Word to the “Why’s” of Some Christmas Traditions

Over the centuries and across many nations and cultures, the Feast of Christmas is celebrated with joy and profound thanks for God’s greatest gift, His Son. Here are a few reasons behind some of those traditions.

Why do we call it Christmas?

From the Old English “Cristes Mæsse” ~ meaning the “mass of Christ.” It was common to refer to any feast as the “Mass of...,” for example, the feast of St. Michael was called Michaelmas. The practice dates back to the 11th century.

Why do some call it Xmas?

This is a Greek abbreviation. The word for Christ in Greek is Xristos. In the 16th century, Europeans used the first initial of Christ's name, "X" in place of the word Christ in Christmas. It was just a shortened form of the word. These Christians understood that X stood for Christ's name. Later, others who did not understand the Greek language, including many Christians, assumed it was a secular title and mistook "Xmas" as a sign of disrespect. Unfortunately, this may have happened.

Why are there Twelve Days of Christmas?

During the Middle Ages [c. 400-1400], Christmas was a festival of feasting and merrymaking that lasted from Christmas Eve until the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6, twelve days later. Epiphany is from the Greek meaning “to show,” marking the time that Jesus was revealed to the world. As late as the 19th century, Epiphany was as big a celebration as Christmas Day.

Why do we send Christmas cards?

Sir Henry Cole of England is credited with creating the first real Christmas card. He was so busy in December 1843 that he had no time to compose individual letters for his friends. He commissioned an artist to design a card with three panels. The center panel showed a family enjoying Christmas with the message "A Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to You."

Why do we hang Christmas stockings?

This comes from a famous legend about St. Nicholas. The story is told of a kindly nobleman who grew despondent over the death of his beloved wife and squandered his fortune. This left his three young daughters without dowries and facing a life of spinsterhood or worse.

Generous St. Nicholas, hearing of the girls' plight, wanted to help, but knew the father would not accept money from him. Wishing to remain anonymous, he rode by the man's house and threw three small pouches of gold coins down the chimney. The pouches fell into the girls' stockings that had been hung on the mantelpiece to dry.

The story about St. Nicholas' generosity spread throughout the land. Since then, it has been a tradition to hang stockings on Christmas in the hope of receiving a gift from St. Nicholas.

What about Rudolph?

Sorry, but there is no legend, no custom, no long history. This was a 20th century advertising campaign. In 1939, a retailer called Montgomery Ward asked one of their copywriters to come up with a Christmas story; it was given to customers during the holiday shopping season as a store promotion. In 1947, the story was published commercially as a book. At the same time, a song was written and recorded. The story and song have grown beyond their commercial origins to become a beloved part of the holiday.

This is only a sampling of the many, many traditions that have grown up with our understanding of Christ's birth all those years ago. What traditions do you celebrate? As Christians, we all come together to celebrate this great feast of God's love.

First Reading ~ Isaiah 7:10-14

In today's passage, the prophet Isaiah announces that the wife of Ahaz will soon have a son who will be a better king than his father. Christians have seen in this passage a deeper meaning, namely, Mary giving birth to Jesus.

Second Reading ~ Romans 1:1-7

In the opening words of the letter to the Romans, Paul first identifies himself, extends a greeting, gives some helpful information about himself, and highlights the fact that Jesus was descended from the Royal House of David.

Gospel ~ Matthew 1:18-24

Joseph trusted God and believed in the message of the angel. Even though he was afraid, he was open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit in his life, which ultimately led to the birth of Jesus, Emmanuel, God is with us. Let us pray for a deeper openness to the spirit in our lives this Advent.


