Men's Prayer Group

It was over nine years ago that we began the Men's Prayer Group of our Parish Community. We started with just a few men, and I am delighted to announce that today, our St. Frances Cabrini Men's Prayer Group now has 25 to 30 men gathering at our meetings. We began meeting in the rectory but quickly outgrew the rectory and moved to the Father Laut Conference Room. With the opening of our new Parish Center, we have been meeting in the Conference Room on the first floor of the Parish Center. **We meet on the first and third Saturdays of the month from 7:00 AM to 8:45 AM.** Some of the men have commented that it is the fastest part of their Saturday morning!

A typical gathering would begin with brief self-introductions when someone new is in attendance, and then we listen to inspiring music. Just prior to the recitation of the rosary, everyone would have the opportunity to express a particular intention for the rosary. Following the rosary, there is an opportunity to have some coffee and fellowship before re-gathering with the Group. Prior to the meetings, Roger Kean, our leader and facilitator, forwards the Sunday scripture readings for the weekend liturgies along with some reflection questions. Following the coffee break, the three readings for the weekend liturgy are proclaimed. Although it has been our experience from the very beginning of our Prayer Group that the men readily and actively participate in the discussions, it is always at the discretion of the individual man as to whether or not he participates in any of the discussions/reflections. No one is ever "put on the spot" to speak or comment.

As the Lord continues to call men to a deeper relationship with Him, I am pleased to invite the men of our Parish Community to consider coming together and allowing the Holy Spirit to guide them along their spiritual journey, realizing that they do not journey alone but rather they move forward in their spiritual lives with other men.

Although this invitation is directed to the men of the Parish Community, there is a blessing for all the women and indeed all our parish families. If this invitation is embraced, I believe that our men will find themselves becoming better men, better sons, better husbands, better fathers, and better Catholics, and that the Parish Community itself will become spiritually stronger and better!

When we began in June 2013, Bruce Kean, who actively established and promoted our Men's Prayer Group, offered the following reflection and invitation and they are still apropos today for the men of our Parish Community to ponder:

"At some time in our lives, we all struggle with the burdens of life. It is difficult in today's world to be an authentic Catholic, loving husband and father, while maintaining balance between work and a joyful spirit.

Why not consider a small sacrifice and say yes to a heartfelt relationship with Jesus. Attend the St. Frances Cabrini Men's Prayer Group meeting the first and third Saturday morning of each month. It can be a small step to a big change in your life."

Scripture Readings: The Epiphany of the Lord



First Reading ~ Isaiah 60:1-6

The last part of the book of Isaiah contains the words of the prophet who lived after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon (which is modern-day Iraq). They found their temple destroyed and the city leveled. But with great faith the prophet envisions a wonderful future for Jerusalem.

Second Reading ~ Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

The Ephesians were a community in which Jewish and Gentile converts to Christianity lived side-by-side. The author of this letter confirms that God's saving grace is available to everyone, whatever their ethnic or religious background.

Gospel ~ Matthew 2:1-12

Jesus is the recipient of the magi's homage and gifts. Matthew is teaching that Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promises to the Israelites. Jesus is the light to all nations. Other nations have come to recognize their Lord.


