

Happy Lent 2024! This awesome season has caught up with us quickly this year for sure. Didn't we just celebrate Christmas and the New Year?

For most of us, life is all about go, go, go, getting to the next thing hopefully on time while struggling to keep such complicated family schedules going that even NASA engineers are impressed. There leaves little time, little energy, or little spirit left for our relationships with Jesus or our parish community. Lent is the time for all of us to STOP! or better yet, take that detour up ahead on this superhighway of life. The Church invites us to take the more scenic route, away from the busy-ness of life to the desert and time to get real and right with Jesus. It is in the isolation of the desert that we are left to ourselves, even if it is in our mind and hearts, to be safe and secure with Jesus. The desert can be lifegiving and the very place where truth comes to be. Jesus spent time in the desert and the people of the Old Testament spent a lot of time searching in the desert for new life and new directions, so the proverbial desert can be a source of comfort, challenge, and truth telling for us too.

Lent is the one time or season of the year when we are encouraged to STOP doing things or holding on to beliefs or attitudes that keep us from God.

We are encouraged to Pray always, Give more, and Fast from

Pray always... keep Jesus on your mind and in your heart from the time you wake up until the time you close your eyes.

Give *more...* Reach out with your time, talent, or treasure with the rice bowl.

and in the words of Pope Francis:

Fast from hurting words and say kind words.

Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.

Fast from anger and be filled with patience.

Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.

Fast from worries and have trust in God.

Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.

Fast from pressures and be prayerful.

Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy.

Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.

Fast from grudges and be reconciled.

Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.

Lent began in the ancient church for the people coming into the faith as adults. The practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving were their preparation to join the faith community fully at Easter. Our parishioners, Brandy Lengele and Dale Walton are preparing to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. On Saturday, February 17, they joined hundreds of catechumens and candidates at the cathedral to begin the final journey through the Christian Initiation process. They begin the time of enlightenment with us all to get real with who we are and to remember whose we are as children of God. Let us spend quality time with the Lord daily and let us pray for Brandy, Dale and all those who are preparing for the Easter Vigil.

REPENIS, BELIEVE

Repent, and believe in the gospel. To repent means to feel regret and sorrow and to change, or "turn from" what is evil. Gospel is a word meaning "good news." To "repent and believe in the Gospel" is the twofold call of the Christian, which is brought into profound relief during the Lenten season. This time of prayer and preparation for Easter shows there is indeed cause for regret and sorrow, and a need for change. And yet, what we are turning toward as we turn from sin is always cause for joy and hope.

Genesis 9:8-15 1 Peter 3:18-22 Mark 1:12-15

In the first reading, God makes a covenant with Noah. In the second reading, Peter reflects on how the waters of the flood prefigured baptism. In the Gospel, Jesus is driven into the desert for 40 days before beginning to preach: *The kingdom of God is hand.* Repent, and believe in the gospel.




