

FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

In December 2020, as part of the Catholic Leadership Institute's Next Generation Catholic Parish Initiative, our Parish Envisioning Team was formed and charged with the task of creating a vision for the future of our Parish. The group worked tirelessly for a year, developing Purpose and Vision Statements, identifying core values and beliefs, and setting three top priorities for growth as a Parish Community. Those priorities are to create a community that is 1) Fully Engaged in the Mass, 2) Fully Informed through Education and Formation, and 3) More Committed and Involved in Parish Life. Since the introduction of the Parish Pastoral Plan in December of 2021, the Parish Implementation Team has been discovering ways to turn the vision into reality. The recently completed Faith Enrichment Series on the Eucharist is one of the fruits of the Implementation Team's labors, fostering growth in all three priorities.

It was an honor to be invited to participate as a Core Team member for the Faith Enrichment Series. The work of the Holy Spirit was evident in every step of the planning process as well as in the presentations and discussions that took place at every session. The buzz of conversation as people arrived a little early and greeted each other every time we met, and again during the periods of reflection and discussion, was a symphony of sound that gave witness that the Holy Spirit was active among us. Over 260 people were blessed to participate in the four-part Series. Forty of those participants were facilitators who gathered prior to the main sessions to experience the series as participants, in order to better focus on their role as facilitator when meeting with the general participants. On behalf of Monsignor McCormac and the other members of the Core Team, Theresa Leonetti-O'Connor and Audrey Wilson, I want to publicly thank our parishioners who, inspired by the Holy Spirit, stepped out of their comfort zone to serve as small faith sharing group facilitators. During every session, the facilitators were there to encourage, inspire and support their fellow parishioners in sharing their reflections on their relationships with Jesus and their understanding of the Eucharistic Prayer.

The feedback we are receiving from those who participated in the Faith Enrichment Series has been overwhelmingly positive. Kara Haggerty said, "My best takeaway was getting to know the other

parishioners in my group and seeing the interaction of our parishioners in the other groups. Coming together as a faith community in a place and occasion other than Mass was life giving." Roger Kean said, "Programs were excellently written to stimulate conversation, speakers were obviously filled with the Holy Spirit." Susan Benway shared, "At the first session, people were sometimes reluctant to initiate discussions on the various topics. At later sessions, as we became more familiar with each other, people became more comfortable with sharing their thoughts." She also noted that "The video clip from the Mass and explanation of that part of the Mass was a great teaching tool. Too often during Mass, we become lost in thought or prayer and the video clips emphasized the importance of fully participating in the celebration of Mass." For many people, the opening prayer of each session, Lectio Divina, was one of the highlights of the evening. Not only did the Lectio Divina experience set the tone for each session, for many participants it was the first time they had personally prayed the Scripture, focusing on a short passage and listening for the unique message God was sharing with them through the Living Word. As a result of their participation in the Series, our parishioners are better prepared to participate more fully in the Mass, are more fully informed about the various parts of the Eucharistic Prayer, and have been encouraged and invited to become more committed and involved in Parish life. The Faith Enrichment Series has definitely fostered growth in all three of our Parish Priorities. As Roger Kean said, "Mission accomplished."

But there is actually more to the mission. From the various groups of the Faith Enrichment Series on the Eucharist, we hope to launch a parish initiative introducing the concept of Small Faith Sharing Groups. These groups would typically consist of six to eight people. It's usually best to keep the number smaller to allow enough time for everyone to have an opportunity to share their thoughts and experiences. To get started, the book "Beautiful Eucharist" by Matthew Kelly could be used as the basis for group discussion and faith sharing. Meetings would be held at the convenience of the group, most likely monthly, on a day and time agreed upon by the members of the group. Depending on the group, meetings could take place in one of the gathering spaces here on the Cabrini campus or in the home of one of the group participants. The purpose of the groups would be to gather with members of our faith community to pray through Lectio Divina, to discuss God's Word, to share our individual stories with each other, to connect our faith with our everyday lives, and to support one another as we grow in prayer and in our understanding of our faith. We invite you to watch for an invitation to join a Small Faith Sharing Group and when that invitation is extended to prayerfully consider joining with your fellow parishioners to explore, expand, and share your gift of faith.

May the Lord continue to bless our efforts in growing into a deeper relationship with Him, fostering a communal spirit among our parishioners, and renewing our commitment to our Parish ministries, programs, and organizations.




