Martha's Cupboard Ministry Update By Al and Kathy Madeley

In our Parish Bulletin on March 12th, 2023, we asked our Saint Frances Cabrini Parish Community, "How can we answer Christ's call to 'feed the hungry'?" as we are asked to do when practicing one of the Corporal Works of Mercy. Now, a year and a half later, we can report that we have found a Ministry that has answered this question. This Ministry is our very own St. Frances Cabrini's Martha's Cupboard.

By now, we hope that many of you are aware that our Cupboard is located in the Father Heron building, which is directly across from the Father Laut building on Goble Court. The Cupboard now operates on Saturdays from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM and again on Mondays from Noon to 2:00 PM, and our guests can visit once a week. Still very much dealing with the long-term effects of the high rate of inflation, this year, we have experienced a major increase in guests who visit us, more than doubling our former number of guests. We are now serving 150 households.

Al and I have had numerous opportunities to witness the miracle of the loaves and fishes occurring each time we open a bag of much needed groceries given by our parishioners or see the many donations of Gift Cards to local food stores, which enables us to buy food and fill the shelves. We have been blessed to witness the unselfish sharing of our many dedicated volunteers' time, talents, and treasure to this Ministry.

In addition, we regularly receive donations from local food stores, namely, the Giant in Fairless Hills, the Giant in Morrisville, BJ's, and McCaffrey's, with occasional assistance from the ShopRite in Fairless Hills and Wegmans.

We believe that the Holy Spirit was instrumental in securing the necessary funding for the much-needed building upgrades and refrigeration from a generous State Grant through the office of former State Representative John Galloway. Also, the Holy Spirit has been very busy, since we now have a partnership with Waste Management and the Falls Township Fire-Marshals which adds much to our Cupboard's ability to provide Thanksgiving meals at this special time of year.

Oh, and we can't forget the many turkeys and hams that arrive from you, our generous parishioners, who are moved to share your Thanksgiving and Christmas bounty with your neighbors. We are pleased to tell you more about what the State Grant has enabled us to do, but we will save that for a later date. Right now, we have a more urgent matter to bring to your attention. This weekend, we are conducting our monthly food collection for Martha's Cupboard with special attention on the food needed to provide Thanksgiving meals to our guests.

Last weekend, we handed out Manna Bags at the doors of church after every Mass. Each bag had a list of needed items attached to it. Some of the items mentioned on the list include yams, instant potatoes, corn, carrots, boxed stuffing, pineapple and fruit cocktail. The list noted that canned fruit and mixed vegetables are quickly depleted items. Please see our Parish Website for a complete list of needed items. You don't have to use a Manna Bag to donate to the Cupboard. You can place the needed items into any bag or box and bring it to church this weekend by noon on Sunday or drop it off at the rectory at any time.

Thank you for helping us fill the shelves in anticipation of Thanksgiving and Christmas. We are looking forward to the many blessings we will be experiencing through our Ministry as we strive to help others evercome the many challenges of providing a holiday meal for their family.

All of us at Martha's Cupboard are so excited to share with you how Martha's Cupboard Ministry has grown in the number of volunteers, the number of guests we serve and in the number of improvements we have made to the physical building. We cannot wait to show you what's going on inside the doors of the Cupboard. Please stay tuned for future updates and may God bless all of us and all those whom we serve!

First Reading: Isaiah 53:10-11



Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

In this passage, James and John request positions of honor in Jesus' glory. Jesus teaches them about true greatness, emphasizing that leadership in His kingdom involves serving others rather than seeking power. He exemplifies this by stating that He came not to be served, but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many.




