Coping with Grief

I am grateful to Monsignor McCormac and Jean Madden for the blessing of providing this week's message. It may come as no shock to many of you that I was utterly filled with joy last weekend when Monsignor McCormac. Monsignor Magee, and Deacon Mace Mazzoni were vested in their rose-colored vestments, as well as looking into the sanctuary and seeing the rose-colored candle of our Advent wreath glowing with a bright flame. As Christmas draws near, each candle which is lighted reminds us that Jesus is the light coming into the darkness. Jesus said to those who followed Him." I am the light of the world, he who follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

Personally, this year's Third week of Advent is like none I have ever experienced before in my life. What is looming over this is the physical absence of my Mom in my life. I feel a struggle in my heart between joy and sadness, while at the same time, I feel deep compassion and empathy for all those who are also experiencing such a loss especially within our faith community. The loss is very profound regardless of whether it is recent, a few years ago, or many years ago, I would also like to acknowledge and address those who are experiencing other losses in their lives at this time. It could be the loss of a job, the loss of a home, the loss of good health, or the loss of one's physical independence. The list is endless, but a loss is a loss and never felt more deeply than now as we approach the Christmas season.

What words can I speak to this sorrow, this loss and emptiness especially present at this time. The only words that can bring us true Christian peace and joy are the words we find in Sacred Scripture. The scripture readings proclaimed at all our Masses during these Advent days are filled with "good news" of hope, joyful expectancy, restoration, promise, salvation and an assurance that our God, Emmanuel, is God with us. I strongly encourage you to pray with these readings especially the Gospel each day looking for a word, phrase, or message to take into your minds and hearts. Give God's word the power to become real and relevant in your lives, God's word can transform our lives from the inside out.

Another question and challenge for me while experiencing loss in my life, and for those of you experiencing loss, is how we enter and stay within the season of our Church allowing the Church's season to impact and effect the season we experience in the world. The very words we hear of comfort and joy, peace, and hope may be hard to take in at times. First, we must expect the pain and memory of the loss, especially of our loved one to continue to occur for the rest of our lives. With God's grace, we are assured that it will ease in time but never go away until we are reunited with them in heaven. We will experience moments when we think we are getting along better regarding our loss, and then the memory of our loved one will come rolling upon us like the crash of an ocean wave seemingly to knock us over How do we recover when this happens? Is there a way to brace ourselves for this? I have found that the answer is allowing gratitude to pull me up and brace me to carry on. There is a quote from Martha Hickman's book entitled Healing After Loss which states," The greatest tribute to the dead is not grief but gratitude." Gratitude can move us from the place within ourselves where the focus is on what we lost, and where we lose focus on why we were created, why we are still here and what is our purpose? We were created in love by Almighty God

and created for love. We are our best selves when we love God with our entire being and love our neighbor as ourselves. Love is what makes our hearts ache and long for our loved ones, but when love is enabled to come out from within us, it has the power to transform our pain and suffering and heal us. Our act of loving also makes real and present the person we are mourning.

Our greatest enemy in our grief is to be alone all the time and to stay in mourning. It can have detrimental effects upon our hearts minds and bodies. God did not create us to be alone or journey through life alone. I implore you to be with journey through life alone I implore you to be with the community here at Saint Frances Cabrini, First and foremost, be with us in the celebration of Mass. Nothing compares to being here in person. While praying the Mass may be difficult for some who are experiencing loss; it is necessary, if you are physically able, to go beyond the feelings and be at Mass with the worshiping community. Mass is where we profoundly receive the Living God, the substance our souls need and long for The Mass where heaven and earth are joined in a timeless. is where heaven and earth are joined in a timeless and profound way. We cannot experience this anywhere else it is during the celebration of the Mass that we are closest to those we love who are now with the Lord. Do not worry about crying when you are here. I am always reminding folks especially those at our Bereavement sessions, "in this church, we all cry together." We are greatly blessed here at Saint Frances Cabrini to continue to provide the live streaming of the Mass on Sunday morning at 11 00 AM for those not able to join us in person. We continue to be very grateful to those who provide this ministry. Also, for our Homebound, our Music Director. Jean Madden just did a beautiful video message, and provided a wonderful pastoral column in our Parish Bulletin last week inviting you to call the rectory or visit the website if you would like to have our Christmas carolers stop by your home during their caroling journey on Thursday, December 26th. Jean also invited you to join the carolers and participate with them in their caroling journey. Again, please call the rectory or visit the Parish. website. There are many ways at Saint Frances. Cabrini to be in community with others. No one needs to be alone. Just ask someone on our Parish Staff or call the rectory and we can contact you.

In closing, Christmas brings us home, Mary, Joseph, and the Child Jesus had to change their homes from time to time. Our physical homes are temporary but our forever home while here on earth is the Catholic Church. It is the place where the family of God both on earth and in heaven are united in love, gathered to praise and thank God. We profoundly experience and receive God's unconditional love in Word and Sacrament. Come home here to Saint Frances Cabrini for Christmas May the blessings of God be upon you and your families, filling you with His peace and joy.

God's ways are different from ours.

The Lord God is always faithful to his promises. As our celebration of Christmas draws near, we prepare for the coming of Christ by rejoicing with Mary and her cousin Elizabeth as they witness to the mysterious fulfillment of those divine promises in their lives.






