

A Pastoral Message from Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez on the Occasion of the Season of Advent

This year, perhaps more than ever, we need Christmas and its promise of hope for a suffering humanity in the person of Jesus Christ. To fully understand and be ready to accept that profound gift on Christmas day, we must prepare our minds and hearts.
