He entered the program of priestly formation at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary in 2019 following a year of studies at Villanova University. Deacon Ekeagwu one of eight children. He has been serving as a Transitional Deacon at Mary, Mother of the Redeemer Parish in North Wales (Montgomery) for the past year in final preparation for Ordination to the Priesthood.
